Thank you for supporting our effort in continuing to keeping the school safe and healthy. Cases of COVID -19 remain relatively high in Cheshire East so we would urge you to adhere to the following safety measures if at possible:

**Regular testing:** Those that are eligible should test at least twice throughout the half-term break and just before you return to school on Tuesday November 2nd.

There is also the option of booking a PCR test for children who are unwell without classic COVID symptoms by clicking 'I've been told to get a test by my local council' on the online booking service.

**Household Cases / Isolation**: If someone in your household tests positive, arrange for a PCR test for everyone else, and children should not attend school for a minimum of 5 days.
