Transition

Transition is the experience children have when they move to a new setting - this might be a new school or a new class. Transition is an important learning experience as change is ongoing throughout our lives and something that is important to be able to manage successfully.

As such we recognise the importance of careful planning for children's transition experiences. We know the experiences children have at key transition points can offer an opportunity for each child to develop positive learning dispositions regarding 'change', which will enable children to develop their emotional and social well-being, as well as their sense of identity.

Children who develop positive attributes such as strength, resilience, independence and self-confidence will be able to call on these attributes to support transitions throughout their lives.

Transition at Bosley is viewed as building strong and trusting relationships between children, adults and parents/carers, through effective communication and supporting the consistent transfer of existing relationships and relevant information. At Bosley we aim to support transition through a range of opportunities both across the year and as the children get closer to 'moving on.' This year, children will be making their transition into their new class from 3rd July year rather than in September.

The plan is as follows:

Children will come to school as normal and will be registered in their current class. All children will then have a maths lesson as normal.

After play, children will make the transition into their new class where they will complete work planned carefully by their class teachers. Children will continue their learning right up until the end of the term.

Children will return to their current class at around 3pm and will be dismissed as normal from their original classrooms.

Usually, children spend a day or an afternoon with their new teachers, however, this year, we wanted the children to spend more time with their new class and new teacher to hopefully create a sense of belonging and an opportunity for the children to settle before September.

Staffing structure for 2023/24 will be announced next week.

Blossom class have been continuing to look at traditional tales and in particular have been looking at the story Little Red Riding Hood.

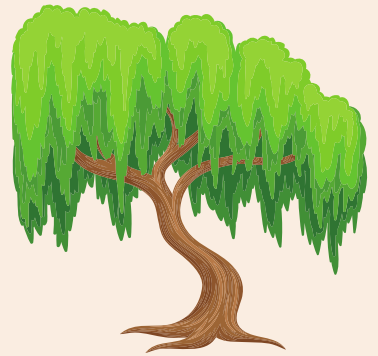
In their design and technology work they have been looking at making moving parts in pictures. This week, they created wheels in pictures.
