School doors open at 8:40

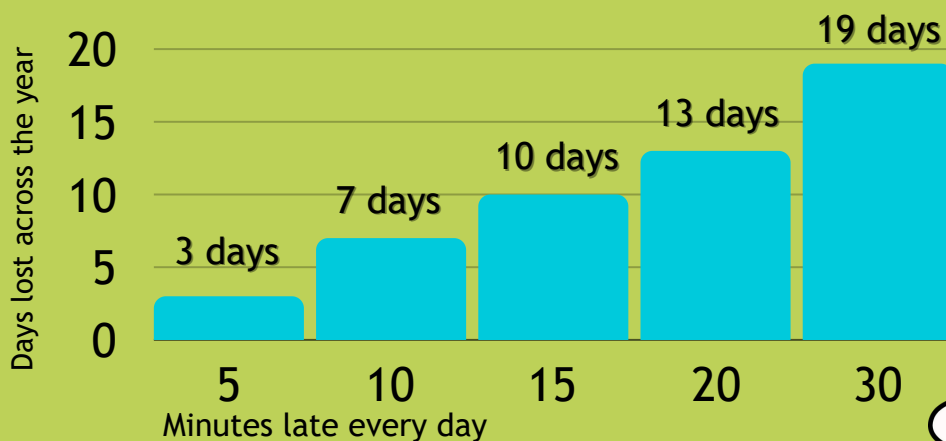
